Helen has worked tirelessly for over 30 years to help and support families and communities impacted by institutional abuse. She founded In Good Faith and Associates in 1997 and in 2013 oversaw the transition of IGFA to charitable organisation, In Good Faith Foundation. Throughout this time Helen has made significant contributions to government inquiries, social and cultural reforms and public awareness raising.

In 2018, Helen announced her transition from CEO to Principal Practitioner of IGFF and continued her work advocating for accessible justice and fair compensation for survivors. Clare Leaney was announced as incoming CEO, having worked alongside Helen for over 7 years.

Over the years, Helen has provided mentoring and support to staff; providing inspiration to all those at IGFF. On behalf of IGFF Board of Directors, staff and clients we are grateful to Helen for her dedication and leadership during her time working at IGFF.
